Broome Highlights

JEWELLERY AND PEARL SHOWROOMS

Admire the lustrous pearls at one of Chinatown's magnificent pearl and jewellery showrooms as you meander around the newly revitalised Chinatown precinct or visit a working pearl farm!

STREETER'S JETTY | Jin-Gurramarnin

This historically significant jetty, on Dampier Terrace, is a favourite for tourists visiting the area, and remains an important reminder of Broome's past. Recently reconstructed and the starting point for the Jetty to Jetty trail (approx 2.5kms) marked by distinctive red signs.

CHINATOWN

A boutique retail hub and a site of historical significance - the heart and soul of Broome. Take a stroll down Jonny Chi Lane and enjoy a coffee under the new shaded spaces.

SUN PICTURES - OUTDOOR PICTURE GARDENS

The world's oldest operating picture gardens is open for visitors to step back in time and uncover historical cinematic treasures.

TOWN BEACH | Guwarri

Town Beach has undergone a wonderful redevelopment and features the new jetty, play ground and water park.

CABLE BEACH | Walmanyjun

Take a walk along the world famous Cable Beach and watch the camel trains. See a spectacular sunset over the Indian Ocean.

BROOME'S JAPANESE & CHINESE CEMETERIES

Gain an appreciation for the lives sacrificed by the Asian migrants who settled in Broome to prosper from Broome's lucrative pearling industry. Entry is free and location is on Port Drive.

GANTHEAUME POINT

View the amazing sandstone rock formations and lighthouse at this popular photography spot. See the replica dinosaur footprint and on very low-tides you can see the actual dinosaur foot prints.

SSJG HERITAGE CENTRE

The Heritage Centre is a place for sharing of social history related to the Sisters of St John of God and First Nations people.

BROOME HISTORICAL MUSEUM

Broome Historical Society Museum offers an insightful look into Broome's diverse cultural history. Take a walk through the 1890s former general store and the Sailmaker's Shed. Open 10am - 1pm.

ROEBUCK BAY LOOKOUT

This recently completed lookout is a highlight of the award-winning Jetty to Jetty App. Take the self-guided Yawuru heritage walk along Roebuck Bay foreshore. (The free app is available to download for smartphones from App Store or Play Store.)

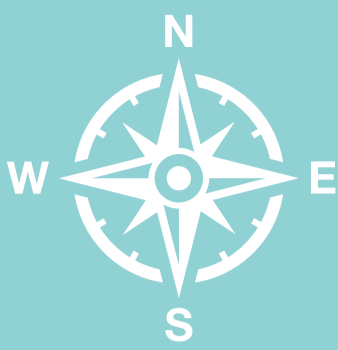

CABLE BEACH
 One of the most beautiful stretches of beach in the world. Cable Beach takes its name from the cable which linked Broome with what is present day Indonesia. Stingers may be present during the months from November to May. Always check by asking the Broome Visitor Centre before swimming.

BROOME PEARLING HISTORY
 Broome owes its early beginnings to the discovery in 1861 of the giant pearl oyster Pinctada Maxima which led to the establishment of Broome's pearling industry.

DINOSAUR FOOTPRINTS
 Believed to be those of a carnivorous species that lived 120 million years ago, the tracks are embedded in sandstone at the base of the cliff and can only be seen at low tides of 2.16m for one set of prints and 1.46m or lower for three sets of prints. PLEASE TAKE CARE AS YOU DO NEED TO CLIMB DOWN THE CLIFF FACE TO VIEW THE FOOTPRINTS.
